## ARTS

### [Regional Arts WA](#)

#### State Funding

- [The Regional Arts Sector Investment Program](#): The fund is open to not-for-profit regional organisations who deliver a program of arts activities to their community. **Applications are currently closed.**
- [RAF Relief Grant](#): Relief grants are designed to assist regional artists, arts organisations and communities to meet their immediate needs. This could include asset replacement or purchase, support for arts practice (including self-directed residency/research and development), small projects and professional development opportunities. **Applications are currently open on an ongoing basis until all funds have been expended. All RAF Relief projects must be completed by 30 June 2021.**
- [RAF Recovery Grants](#): Recovery grants are designed to meet the medium-term recovery needs of artists, organisations and communities. Projects in this program should focus on activities that assist in recovery from the impacts of COVID-19. **The RAF Recovery Round will open in July 2020, closing October 2020 for projects starting after 1 January 2021. All RAF Recovery projects must be complete by 30 June 2024.**
- [Drug Aware YCulture Regional Grant](#) helps young people aged 12 to 26 to actively create, plan, manage and deliver their own arts projects. **Applications open all year round, but must be submitted six weeks prior to the proposed commencement date of the project.**
- [Regional Arts Resilience Grants](#): Resilience Grants are designed to assist regional artists, arts organisations and communities to sustain creative practices and participate in the regional economy during the immediate period of disruption caused by COVID-19. **Applications close November 26 2020.**

### [Government of WA Department of Culture and the Arts](#)

The Department of Culture and the Arts offers a range of funding programs available to Western Australian artists, designers, communities and organisations. These grants aim to support vibrant and sustainable arts, culture and creative industry sectors in WA.

- [Playing WA](#): Grant supports the costs of touring performing arts shows to regional and remote towns and communities in Western Australia. **The current round of applications close on September 29.**

The Australia Council for the Arts offers a broad range of grants for Australian artists and arts organisations.

Organisations that undertake arts programs, projects or that provide services to artists are welcome to apply. **Applications are currently closed.**

Supported activities must last no longer than three years from the proposed start date. **Applications are closed.**

The Ian Potter Foundation supports charitable organisations that work to benefit the community across a broad range of sectors and industries.

- [Community Wellbeing Grant](#): The grant aims to improve circumstances for vulnerable members of the community, by supporting organisations that seek to establish pathways for vulnerable individuals. Applications from high-need areas that have a strong volunteer component and/or volunteer Board that is a representative cross-section of the community is encouraged. **Due to COVID-19, the funding rounds for September and December 2020 will not open. Instead, for the remainder of 2020, the Foundation will consider grant applications by invitation only.**

### [Lotterywest Grants](#)

Lotterywest's grants can help to make a difference to life in Western Australia. Grants are available to not-for-profit organisations and Local Governments. Organisations not legally incorporated or not registered for GST can receive single or multiple grants with a combined total of up to \$15,000 in any one financial year. Lotterywest accepts requests from \$3,000 upwards.

**Applications are usually open year round, however in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the State Government, through Lotterywest, has allocated all profits of the Lottery (up to \$159 million) directly into the newly created COVID-19 Relief Fund. Lotterywest's previous Community Investment Framework, launched in 2019, is on hold while the COVID-19 Relief Fund is delivered.**

## RESEARCH

### [Healthway Health Promotion Research Grants](#)

Each year, Healthway awards a number of community grants that focus on at least one of Healthway's strategic priorities; increasing healthy eating, increasing physical activity, improving mental health, preventing harm from alcohol, creating a smoke-free WA and Aboriginal health.

- **Intervention Research Grants:** Applications for this scheme will develop and test, or lead to or inform a new health promotion program or policy intervention specifically aligned to a Healthway priority. Healthway will provide up to \$120,000 per annum for three years, and \$150,000 per annum for the year/s the intervention will be developed.
- **Exploratory Research Grants:** The overall purpose of these grants is to support exploratory or formative studies to address gaps in research relevant to Healthway's high priority areas, with demonstrated potential to influence health promotion in the WA community. These grants may lead to the development of larger studies to trial interventions. Healthway will provide up to \$75,000 over two years for these grants.
- **Health Promotion Research Fellowships:** Healthway Postdoctoral Research Fellowship grants are designed to increase the number of experienced and trained researchers in WA working in health promotion research. Applicants can apply for a Postdoctoral Early Career or Senior Research Fellowship for up to three years to undertake their research.
- **Health Promotion Research Training Scholarships:** Healthway's Scholarship grants are designed to increase the number of experienced and trained practitioners and researchers in WA

working in health promotion research. Applicants can apply for up to two (2) years to undertake a Masters or three (3) years to undertake a PhD degree.

- **Aboriginal Research Training Scholarships:** These scholarships are designed to increase the number of experienced and trained Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander practitioners and researchers in WA working to promote health in Aboriginal communities. The Scholarships will support graduates of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent to undertake a post-graduate course focusing on Aboriginal health. This can include a graduate certificate, postgraduate diploma, honours, PhD or Masters.
